## IRON COUNTY EXTENSION EDUCATION COMMITTEE MEETING North Lakeland Discovery Center, Manitowish Waters, Wisconsin 54545 Thursday, July 12, 2018

Call to Order: Meeting called to order at 10:30 a.m. by Extension Office Manager Rebecca Holm.

**Roll Call and Introductions:** Roll call was taken by Holm. Committee members present: William Thomas, Opal Roberts, Brad Matson, Jamey Francis. Committee members excused: Karl Krall. Motion to approve meeting minutes for May 9, 2018: Matson moved to approve minutes for May 9, 2018, seconded by Roberts. Motion carried unanimously.

Motion to approve financial reports: Committee members received Extension and 4-H and Youth Clubs financial reports through May 31, 2018. Roberts moved to approve financial reports for Extension and 4-H and Youth Programs, seconded by Matson. Motion carried unanimously.

**Public Comment:** Matson stated that he would like to see the Farmers Market extend its outreach to Mercer and Springstead. Monroe stated that she would reach out to Kimbler to discuss an outreach strategy.

Area Extension Director Report: Pardee reported on the following:

- **Options for Horticulture Education:** Extension will not cost share an agriculture position in Iron County at this time. Pardee has been working on strategic solutions to solve this problem. Committee members and staff received a handout, which explained three options for the Horticulture/Agriculture Extension Educator coverage.
  - Option 1: Extension Educator (50%) fully funded by Iron County and only serving Iron County.
  - Option 2: Outreach Programmer focused on Horticulture, shared and funded by 2-3 counties.
  - Option 3: County Horticulture/Agriculture Educator (not an Extension employee).
  - These strategic solutions are will be discussed in more detail at the next committee meeting.
- July 1<sup>st</sup> UW Cooperative Extension reorganization took place

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Pardee mentioned that Will Andresen has accepted the new Institute Director for Community Development position. Pardee asked the Extension staff and committee would agree that he continue using his current office space. It was a unanimous vote of yes.
