Motion to approve meeting minutes for July 12, 2018: Roberts moved to approve minutes for July 12, 2018, seconded by Francis. Motion carried unanimously.

Area Extension Director Report: Pardee reported on the following:

- The merger with UW-Madison is still on track and should be complete July 1, 2019
- Community Development Educator interviews set for Monday, Sept 17th
 - o Pardee, Klemme, Will Andresen, and Brad Matson are on the interview committee
- Options for Horticulture Education
 - Pardee presented three options to the committee
 - Option 1 fits the needs of Iron County and is the preferred choice amongst staff
 - Option 2 and 3 would have the potential to be shared positions with other counties, which the committee and staff agreed would not work considering our rural area.

Roberts moved to select option 1 for horticulture education, seconded by Francis. Motion carried unanimously.

Motion to forward proposed 2019 budget to Finance Committee: Pardee and Klemme reviewed the proposed 2019 budget for Extension and 4-H and Youth Clubs along with descriptions of line items, which committee members received in their packets. Francis moved to approve the budget, seconded by Roberts. Motion carried unanimously.

Motion to approve and sign Iron county UW-Extension 136 Contract: Pardee reviewed a draft contract and table detailing 2019 position fees (including Horticulture Education Option 1), which committee members received in their packets. Roberts moved to approve the Iron County UW-Extension 136 Contract as presented, seconded by Francis. Motion carried unanimously. Pardee will draft a final contact, which Bill Thomas will need to sign before December 31st.

Pardee noted that the \$10,000 discount will be removed in the 2020 contracting process. Committee members can contact Dean Karl Martin with their concerns.
