Call to Order: Meeting called to order at 10:30 a.m. by William Thomas.

Motion to approve meeting minutes for April 17, 2019: Roberts moved to approve minutes for April 17, 2019, seconded by Matson. Motion carried unanimously.

Motion to approve financial reports: Committee members received Extension and 4-H and Youth Clubs financial reports through May 31, 2019. Matson moved to approve financial reports for Extension and 4-H and Youth Programs, seconded by Roberts. Motion carried unanimously.

Public Comment: The following items were discussed:

- Iron County Summer Youth Camp
 - Matson congratulated Neil on the new camp location
 - Matson sees the potential in having a similar facility in Iron County
 - o Brianna Zaleski and Robert Vinopal reported on their experiences as camp counselors
 - Zaleski liked that the cabins are spread out, allowing each cabin to have more privacy
 - Vinopal added that he was a camper at North Lakeland Discovery Center, so he was really excited to experience the new facility as a camp counselor
 - o Campers, Lily Youngs and Simon Thompson reported on their experience as campers
 - Youngs stated that she is enjoying the new campfire area, outdoor seating for meals, swimming, and roomy cabins
 - Thompson stated that he is enjoying playing games in his cabin with his bunk mates and counselors and had fun singing songs at campfire
 - O Joyce Gayan stated that she is impressed with how the camp counselors handled the tornado warning, keeping their campers calm by singing campfire songs and wanted to recognize camp volunteer and bus driver, Bill Valenti, for all of his help in the kitchen

Educator Reports

4-H Youth Development - Klemme reported on the following:

- Iron County Summer Youth Camp
 - Even though there were a few issues (tornado warning, high temperatures, mosquitos) all camp staff, counselors and campers are enjoying the new facility
- Iron County Fair August 1-4

- Outpost Camp July 23-26
- TrailBlazers
 - Tuesday sessions were on local trails and Thursday sessions took place in Duluth, Houghton and Bayfield, so participants could experience different mountain bike trails in our region
 - Lunch/travel costs were paid for with a grant received from the Gogebic Range United Way
 - o Klemme also used the United Way grant to purchase 6 mountain bikes for participants to use if they didn't have a bike of their own
 - Participants completed a first impressions survey, which focused on trail development and tourism in biking communities

• Loon & Water Project

- O'Krongly and Iron County Land & Water Conservation's Zach Wilson, during which students set up loon platforms and talked about lake ecology
- o Wilson invited Klemme and some Iron County 4-H members to participate in the second half of this project, where they check the loon platforms
- o Klemme hopes that this will be a yearly project
- School Garden
 - o Two 4-H Leaders have taken the lead on the school garden
 - Leaders and 4-H youth meet every other Monday
- State and National 4-H Trips
 - One Iron County 4-H Youth participated in Youth Conference in Madison and four participated in the Spirit Trip, an East coast bus tour of historic places in American history
 - o Jackie Bradley was selected to be on the Communication and Arts team

Community Development: Nosal reported on the following:

- Blender Bike
 - o Hosted the blender bike at the Brian Nasi Memorial Walk/Run and Lupine Junefest
- Maple Syrup Programming
 - o Attended some open houses with Kimbler in the Spring
 - Looking forward to upcoming programming opportunities
- Attended Workshops/Trainings
 - Town Officials Workshop
 - New Colleague Community Development In-service
 - Presented with Klemme at an MSU Extension Supporting Community Development and Tourism conference
- School Garden
 - o Working with Iron County Human Services mentee program
- ICORF
 - ICORE is doing an inventory of trails across Iron County with plans to host a trail expo in October
- NICER (Northern Iron County Engaged Residents)
 - Coalition based efforts that Nosal, Klemme, and Holm are supporting along with the Hurley Chamber and interested community members

 - Distributed vegetables from the school garden and plant donations from Lakes Flower Cabin in Wakefield to seniors at the dining sites
- Hosted the blender bike at the Across the Borders Senior Information and Awareness Walk in June
- FoodWIse Coordinator, Stephanie Bakker will be returning from maternity leave in August

Agriculture: Kimbler reported on the following:

- Facilitated an Extending the Garden Season Workshop in Mercer on May 8

 - o Kimbler identified a new insect pest for Iron County called viburnum leaf beetle
