A moment of silence was observed for recently deceased committee member, Brad Matson.

Motion to approve meeting minutes for July 17, 2019: Roberts moved to approve minutes for July 17, 2019 seconded by Francis. Motion carried unanimously.

Motion to approve financial reports: Committee members received Extension and 4-H and Youth Clubs financial reports through August 31, 2019. Roberts moved to approve financial reports for Extension and 4-H and Youth Programs, seconded by Francis. Motion carried unanimously.

Educator Reports

4-H Youth Development - Klemme reported on the following:

- Outpost Camp
 - Partnered with Iron County Land & Water Conservation Department's Zach Wilson on a service-learning project about aquatic invasives
- Microsoft Digital Ambassadors
 - \$6500 grant will be used to provide broadband education and online trainings with seniors and youth in Iron County
- Iron County Fair
 - Dairy booth, silent auction, and pie auction were all very successful fundraisers for Iron County 4-H youth
- Community Building/Placemaking
 - o \$5000 grant will be used to create a training to teach youth and community members how to create healthy, vibrant, sustainable communities
 - o Iron, Polk and Iowa County youth will be participating in this project
- Iron County Youth Leadership Council
 - o Three new members were sworn in on August 27
- Shooting Sports
 - o Klemme used the newly purchased .22 and air rifles at Iron County Summer Youth Camp and held a 5-week shooting sports program in August

- 4-H Volunteer Impact Study
 - o Klemme shared the study to highlight the importance of 4-H volunteers in Iron County

FoodWise: Leonard reported on the following:

- Hurley School Garden
 - o Provided education to the Hurley Kids Club students in the school garden
- Iron County Senior Dining Sites
 - o Provided seniors a variety of produce from the school garden
- Nutrition Education
 - o Leonard will be starting nutrition education lessons at the Hurley and Mercer schools
 - The Hurley 5th grade students will be harvesting the potatoes that they planted this spring and will be having a luncheon to celebrate their harvest

FoodWIse Coordinator, Stephanie Bakker reported on the following:

- FoodWIse Educator position is open for Bayfield/Ashland Counties
 - o Mary Pardee and Deb Leonard are on the search and screen committee for this position
 - o Bakker providing direct education in Ashland/Bayfield Counties until new hire starts
- Regional FoodWIse meeting for the North Area
 - o Leonard received a new award though FoodWIse called the Golden Community Engagement Award

Agriculture: Kimbler reported on the following:

- o Master Gardener Volunteers did a great job engaging residents at the fair
- Community members have been stopping by the office with plant and insect questions
- Maple Syrup Happenings
 - o Created a flow chart on how state regulations apply to Maple Syrup Producers
 - o Presenting at a Beginner Maple Syrup Conference in October
 - Attending the International Maple Syrup Producers Association Conference in October with Nosal
- Master Gardener Training
 - o Orientation takes place Wednesday, September 18
 - o 8 people have signed up
 - o Classes start in October and run until February 2020
- Attending engaging Beginning Farmers conference in October

Area Extension Director Report: Pardee reported on the following:

- Superior Days
 - o Douglas County Community Development Educator resigned
 - o This position coordinated Superior Days
 - o Pardee updated Klemme on upcoming plans to hire someone to coordinate Superior Days, which he usually attends with youth from Iron County
- Ashland and Bayfield County Agriculture Educator, Jason Fischbach will be working on upcoming hazelnut projects
 - o Fischbach will be working in a specialist role for 4 years, which means there will be an 80% back fill position available in Ashland/Bayfield County
- Ashland County offices will be moving out of the Ashland County Courthouse
- Pardee, Community Development Institute Director Will Andresen and Vilas County Community Development Educator Chris Stark met with Nosal for her 3 year review on September 9
