## MINUTES OF December 11, 2024, IRON COUNTY FORESTRY & PARKS COMMITTEE MEETING

Meeting called to order at 4:30 pm by Scott Erickson, Chair, at the Iron County Courthouse, 300 Taconite St, Hurley, WI 54534. Forestry/Parks Committee members present include P. Hanson, W. Thomas, S. Erickson, M. Loreti, and Eli Ladwig, Logger Representative, Conner Saari and Elaina Jackson, Student Supervisors. Others present during the meeting included: Eric Peterson, Forest Administrator, Tara Krall, Office Manager, Larry Youngs, County Board Chair, Katy Broquard, Casey Baye, Jenna Malinowski, and Ryan Peasley all from WDNR, Roxanne Lutgen, Kurt Wolff. Tanner Hiller was absent.

Tara Krall verified proper public notice of the meeting.

**Approval of Minutes.** Motion by P. Hanson supported by W. Thomas approving the minutes from October 10, 2024 as written. All in favor, motion carried.

Public Comment: S. Erickson introduced the Student Supervisors Elaina Jackson and Conner Saari.

Chairman report: S. Erickson explained cancellation of the committee meeting last week due to inclement weather.

**Administrator Report:** Current stumpage is \$1,572,659.57 versus \$1,534,704.12 at this time last year.

**DNR Report:** Katy reported the team time standard hours are currently at 785 hours (31%). Teams from other counties have been helping out. Dozing was done on the Schomberg snowshoe trails. Katy has been planning a grouse and woodcock demonstration area off Casey Sag. WDNR is advertising for two LTE Forester positions one to work out of either Mercer or Mellen.

Jenna reported that 260 deer were harvested last year with 333 so far this year, 30 of them antlerless. She feels deer harvesting has gone down due to less hunters including youth and aging population in addition to people hunting elsewhere since Iron County does not have an antlerless hunt. Yearlings look really healthy this year. Twenty CWD samples were taken. The carcass disposal sites are available until the end of the month. She has begun tracking surveys. Jenna is also looking for bear dens and asked if anyone sees a live one to let her know.

**Review and approve Special Use Permit.** Eric explained the Special Event Application and the Permit that was included in the packet.

2024 YTD Timber Sale Receipts -- \$1,572,659.57 vs. \$1,534,704.12 in 2023 Difference - \$37,955.45 (2.5%)

### **Forestry Activity**

- 5 Logging Crews working on ICF.
- 8 active sales (hauling, closeouts, etc.)
- Winter pulpwood markets look poor for contractors.
- 1<sup>st</sup> carbon credit sale was recorded in November. \$1,010,000 gross sale.
- After expenses and Anew's share Iron Co. should receive approximately \$575,000.
- Iron Co. project 1 of 5 selected to be part of special international marketing campaign.

### **County Parks**

- All parks closed for the season and winterized.
- Lake of the Falls campground expansion work completed.
- 15 new campsites added. Minor touchup work to be completed in the spring.
- Sites will not be available on the reservation system until next summer when that work is completed.

#### **County Forest Roads**

- Boomer Creek Road graded.

- Met with White Thunder Riders & Mercer Sno-Goers for winter planning.

- DNR Dozer leveled snowshoe loops at Schomberg Park.
- ORV Council voted to fund the railroad grade purchase in Town of Mercer.
